April 8th was the 2013 designated Pay Equity Day. Our branch took note of the event in several ways.

The Post-Journal published my op-ed on Sunday, the 6th. Maggie's article on the restaurants' participation appeared on April 2nd. I appreciate the newspaper's cooperation with this event and the many other articles they always publish on our activities.

Maggie and I publicized the event on Saturday, the 5th at the Breakfast Party, which is broadcast from Friendly's Restaurant, and Maggie also appeared on Jim Roseli's morning program.

Five restaurants took note of the day, offering a 20% discount for women on lunch or dinner. Please patronize them and thank them: Cibo, Babalu Café, Shawbuck's the Press Room, Labyrinth Press

Get in the Game--Another Success

The 15th annual "Get in the Game" event was held on Saturday, March 98h at Jamestown Community College for girls in grades 4-7. Approximately110 girls from area schools participated in interactive, hands-on stations focusing on various sports. The Jamestown Branch of the AAUW sponsored the local event in support of National Girls and Women in Sports Day along with sponsorship from JCC.

This year's event consisted of 8 interactive stations where girls could experience a wide variety of sports. Local teen and adult women athletes' demonstrated basketball, soccer, rugby, Zumba, track, self-defense, Judo, and kayaking. The girls were able to speak with and ask questions from the athletes, as well as personally participate in each activity. The Babes of Wrath did a roller derby demo at lunch. The purpose of the event is to encourage girls to participate in sports, raise self-esteem through sports, highlight local young female athletes, promote gender equality, and form coalitions with community agencies to support girls and women in sports.

Janet Forbes applied for a grant from the Chautauqua Region Community Foundation for \$500.00. This grant helped cover the cost of food and t-shirts for the girls who participated in GITG. When asked what they learned, girls stated that "All girls can do all sports; It was awe-some and very interesting...fun!"

Loreen Ginnitti received the 2013 YWCA Woman of Distinction Award at a ceremony and reception on April 22nd at the Westfield YWCA. Laurie Ginnitti is a retired teacher and a longtime supporter of the YWCA where she has served on the board in several capacities, including two terms as chair



and a term as secretary. Laurie has been a member of the Westfield Memorial Hospital Auxiliary for 30 years, serving as a Board Member for nine years and during that time holding positions of Secretary for six years and Membership Vice President for two years. As a 16-year-member of the Union Relief Association, she has served as secretary for 10 of them. As a Chautauqua-Westfield Branch AAUW Member for 35 years, Laurie held various executive positions for 33 years. She worked with the girls program of the YWCA to organize three AAUW intergenerational programs: A Career Night, a personality Workshop, and a hobby discovery night, and she brought an "Awareness Theater" Workshop on bullying to the girls long before it became a national issue. In 2004 she chaired a Women's History Month research art project and contest with the after school girls that was sponsored by Chautauqua Westfield AAUW.
